Learning Through Play

Objective Led Planning is a method of teaching that enhances/supports children play. "When you go and play alongside children you get

high levels of engagement"

This type of planning is based on delivering the objective to the children in play and not pulling the children out of play to come to an activity, you may have noticed there are less 'adult led' activities and less 'pictures' to take home. However, please be assured there is still lots of learning going on.

"Children learn best through play"
We offer many activities that do not have a 'final result' that the children take home, but allow children to develop through the

Characteristics of Effective Learning.

Playing & Exploring; Active Learning; and Critical Thinking help children to become confident learners, exploring the world around them, willing to 'have a go' and to think critically about 'how' and 'why' things work. These help children develop the skills they need when they move on to school.

We try to capture as much learning as we can on tapestry, but we also prefer to interact with the children as much as possible so lots of learning is not recorded.

Don't forget to use Tapestry to upload pictures of what your child can do at home. These can be added to support your child's development records.

Outdoor Play

Playing outdoors is vital to children's learning and development and our outdoor provision is a large part of the constant provision available at Cowcliffe Pre-School. We are lucky to have the space, equipment and materials available for the children to explore.

We play out in all weathers at all times of the year. Please ensure your child has appropriate outdoor clothing and footwear. Waterproof clothing and wellies are available at preschool for those that need it.

Many parents believe if their child plays out in the cold they will become ill.
This is a Myth! The only thing that can cause a cold or flu is a cold or flu virus.
Getting cold or wet won't give you a cold (nhs website).



Unfortunately when children start preschool and mix with lots of other children they are exposed to different germs. In time they will build up their own immunity and become more resilient to coughs and colds.
